Dear Caterpillar Member,

Our records indicate that you or your dependent filled a prescription in the past four months for a cholesterol-lowering medication. These include but are not limited to Lescol, Lipitor, Lovastatin, Mevacor, Altoprev, Pravachol and Zocor.

Effective **September 1, 2006**, Caterpillar's prescription drug plan is implementing quantity limits for cholesterol-lowering medications to one tablet per day, per dosage strength.

If you are taking two **same strength** tablets of the **same medication** per day, you can get that same dosage by taking only one tab per day (ex: two 10MG tabs = one 20MG tab). Therefore, effective September 1, you will be required to fill prescriptions with the higher strength one dose tablet.

If you meet the criteria above, please contact your physician for a new prescription before September 1. If you are currently taking only one tablet of a given strength per day, there is no action required.
